## Hines VA Hospital

April 10, 2007: "My husband (Yuriy) served in the marine corps for 3.5 years including tours in Afghanistan and Iraq. He suffered a (traumatic) brain injury. He went through a lot but now is slowly improving. He is having difficulty re-learning to walk. I want to get him out of his wheelchair a lot more. (Yuriy is at Hines VA Hospital and S.A.M. was donated to Hines on July 16, 2007) - *Aimee*
